#### **STANDING RULES FOR STATE MEETING**

**RULE #1:** Professional Dress (i.e., Suit, Sport coat and dress slacks, dress shirt and tie) are required for all who attend the plenary sessions. Delegate or registered non-Delegate credentials shall be required for participation in Plenary Sessions.

**RULE #2:** Official Omega attire for those attending the Memorial Service shall be Official Omega attire: black suit, black socks, black shoes, white shirt, royal purple necktie (no patterns and no bowties)

**RULE #3:** During Plenary Sessions, all speakers will be recognized by the presiding officer. After being recognized, the said brother will officially announce his name and chapter.

**RULE #4:** Profanity or inflammatory remarks are not allowed. If a brother persists in behavior that falls outside the letter, or the spirit of the decorum as promulgated by these rules, he may be asked to remove himself from the plenary session by the presiding officer.

**RULE #5:** All questions and comments should be directed to the presiding officer.

**RULE #6**: All members may make motions and debate the pending question before the assembly within the time and order limitations set by the presiding officer.

**RULE #7:** During debate on a pending motion, each recognized speaker is allowed one question and shall not be permitted to speak on the same motion/issue more than once.

**RULE #8:** During nominations for elected offices, there will be a two-minute nominating speech and one verbal second of the nomination with no speech.

**RULE #9:** Cell phones shall be turned off or put on vibrate before entering plenary sessions. Cell phone use shall be prohibited in plenary sessions and Memorial Service.

**RULE #10:** All voting delegates shall be verified in accordance with the Credentials Committee Rules.

**RULE #11:** The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR) shall govern the proceedings of the State Meeting in all cases to which they are applicable and in which case they are not inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., or the District of Columbia Code on Not-for-profit Organizations. The designated Parliamentarian for the State Meeting shall have a copy of RONR in his possession for reference as needed during the proceedings.

**RULE #12:** The State Representative shall appoint an official timekeeper for the duration of the State Meeting, who will have the responsibility of monitoring each time limited issue that comes before the State Meeting.

**RULE #13:** All motions, resolutions, and other matters concerning the expenditure or commitment of funds will be referred to the Ways and Means Committee for review and comments. This must be done prior to the determining vote. The referral action shall be without debate.

**RULE #14:** All Voting will be conducted via Election Runner apart from simple motions which may be conducted via voice or hand vote.

**RULE #15:** Each member is responsible for his connection to the internet; no action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of, a member's individual connection prevented participation in the meeting.

**RULE #16:** The total time allocated for consideration of each main motion, including bylaw and recommendation amendments, shall be limited to no more than ten (10) minutes.




